What to expect.

We will explain what an Osteopath does, ask you about your medical history including questions about your general health and lifestyle, and of course your current symptoms.

With your consent, we will then proceed with a physical examination (only occasionally we will ask you to remove clothing, again only if you feel comfortable), we will give you a diagnosis, and if appropriate and safe, we will then discuss the plan for the physical treatment and rehabilitation.

It may be that you need to be referred, although this is rare. Any decisions will be made with you based on the best care for your situation.

Is it painful?

Rarely. We will stop immediately if you ask me to stop. We work together on this. We will always ask for your consent.

What we expect?

Please email or bring any scans, documents you believe relevant, ACC details (if current ACC claim include date of incident, ACC number and Read Code).

Please avoid perfume or aftershave before your treatments.

Cancellations.

We sincerely ask you to give us more than 24 hours notice. It's a busy clinic and we often have a waiting list.

Confidentiality.

We respect the confidentiality of the information we gather during the course of the professional consultation. Disclosure only with patient consent or when the law requires under our professional Code of Ethics.

Privacy of information.
